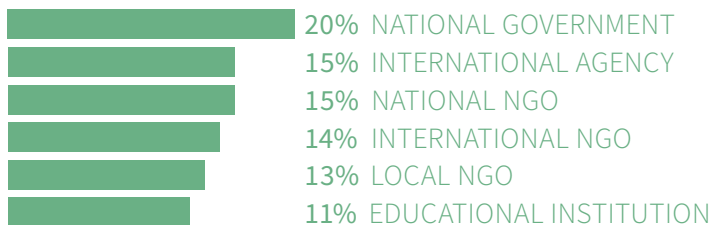

VOLUNTEER PROFILE ROBERT CLEGG

Dr Robert Clegg was an Air Pollution Researcher at the School of Engineering and Environmental Studies in the National University of Mongolia from June 2015 to June 2016.

Ulaanbaatar is one of the most polluted cities in the world and recent studies have suggested 1 in 10 deaths can be connected to air pollution¹.

Robert used his PhD in organic chemistry to assist Mongolian scientists to build up their laboratory and research skills to provide more accurate data to inform pollution interventions.

He also helped acquire modern analytic equipment to enhance the educational and research capacity of the university.
